- 9. For this reason we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to ask that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding;
- 10. that you may walk worthy of the Lord, **fully** pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God;
- 11. strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy;
- 12. giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light.

- 16. So let no one judge you in food or in drink, or **regarding** a festival or a new moon or sabbaths,
- 17. which are a **shadow** of things to come, but the **substance** is of Christ.
- 18. Let no one cheat you of your reward, taking delight in false humility and worship of angels, intruding into those things which he has not seen, vainly puffed up by his fleshly mind,
- 19. and not holding fast to the Head, from whom all the body, nourished and knit together by joints and ligaments, grows with the increase that is from God.
- 20. Therefore, if you died with Christ from the basic principles of the world, why, as though living in the world, do you subject yourselves to regulations-

- 3. <u>As I urged</u> you when I went into Macedonia remain in Ephesus that you may charge some that they teach no other doctrine,
- 4. <u>nor</u> give heed to fables and **endless genealogies**, which **cause** disputes rather than godly **edification** which is in faith.
