- 2. To the church of God which is at Corinth, to those who are

- 3. <u>I was</u> with you in weakness, in **fear**, and in much **trembling**.
- 4. <u>And my</u> speech and my preaching were not with **persuasive** words of human wisdom, but in **demonstration** of the Spirit and of power,
- 5. <u>that your</u> faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God.

- Note 1 In many places in this letter, Paul uses brethren when referring to the Corinthian believers. Therefore, whenever a pronoun is defined as Corinthian believers, Corinthian brethren will also be an acceptable response.
- Note 2 Frequently Paul poses questions of the form "Do you not know...". When the definition states "No answer given" this does not mean that the truth claim has no answer, only that we don't know for sure whether or not the Corinthian believers knew it to be true.
